

UNIT PROFILE

Unit: 94th Airlift Wing, Dobbins Air Reserve Base, Georgia (unit-equipped)

Mission: The mission of the 94th Airlift Wing is to provide highly trained Citizen Airmen who execute versatile and reliable C-130 operations. The Wing is organized into a headquarters element, three groups, and a medical element containing 12 Squadrons and one Flight (approximately 1,600 personnel). Our mission is two-fold. Our primary mission is to maintain combat-ready units to deploy on short notice to support contingencies anywhere in the world. Our secondary mission is to be the host organization for supporting all agencies and tenants at Dobbins Air Reserve Base. To accomplish this, the wing recruits, organizes, and trains Air Force Reservists for active duty in time of war, national emergency, or contingency tasking.

Subordinate Units: The 94th Airlift Wing is made up of 12 Squadrons and one Flight: 80th Aerial Port Squadron, 94th Force Support Squadron, 94th Logistics Readiness Squadron, 94th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron, 94th Civil Engineer Squadron, 94th Aeromedical Staging Squadron, 94th Maintenance Squadron, 94th Operations Support Squadron, 700th Airlift Squadron, 94th Security Forces Squadron, 94th Communications Squadron, 94th Maintenance Operations Flight and 94th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron.

In addition, the Wing supports the 22nd Numbered Air Force Head Quarters and three training units: Readiness and Emergency Management's Training and Certification Center, the Force Support Combat Training Center and AFRC's Transportation Proficiency Center.

Type of Aircraft Flown: C-130H Hercules / 08 Assigned

Major Operations: The 94th Airlift Wing falls under the Air Mobility Command at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois. Contingency operations supported by members of the 94 AW include Operations DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, NOBLE EAGLE, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM and NEW DAWN. Reservists from Dobbins have also participated in PROVIDE PROMISE (Bosnian Airlift), SHINING HOPE, (Kosovo Airlift), and has participated in relief operations for Hurricanes KATRINA and RITA, as well as Operation HELPING HAND following the 2011 earthquake in Haiti.

When not deployed, Airmen continue supporting the mission at home. With more than 70,000 flight operations annually, the Dobbins airfield is extremely active with diverse air traffic operations supported by all branches of the military and other government agencies. This air traffic environment takes place within the boundaries of the busiest airport in the world (Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport), making the activities at Dobbins comparable to many medium-sized commercial airports.

The 94th Airlift Wing is the host organization at Dobbins Air Reserve Base and is responsible for providing security, civil engineering, fire protection, air traffic control, and numerous other services to the base and tenant organizations assigned to the base. This includes the maintenance of the airfield, which is used by Lockheed-Martin/Air Force Plant #6, as well as other Dobbins tenants, such as Air National Guard, Army National Guard, Army Reserve and Marine Corps Reserve.
